HEALTH PROGRAMME FOR FINISH STOVARE

AND NORWEGIAN ELKHOUND, GREY

For the Finnish Stovare, a health programme is being introduced for cerebellar ataxia, a defect in the nervous system that makes it difficult for the dog to coordinate its movements. The examination is carried out with a DNA test. The health programme will be introduced at level 1.

Norwegian Elkhound Grey gets access to the health programme for the eye disease glaucoma and dwarfism, at level 1. Glaucoma is glaucoma which causes increased pressure inside the eye and eventually leads to the dog becoming blind. Both are examined with DNA tests. Level 1 means that the results are registered in the SKK's studbook, but that it is voluntary to have the dogs examined before mating. In order for results to be registered, however, it is required that SKK's DNA referral was used for the sampling and the laboratory conditions are met. Registration for the new health programmes will begin as soon as the technical conditions are in place."
