If you need to renew your insurance for any elderly dogs (over 8 or 9) do shop around and don't only rely on the comparison websites. One of them only had two companies listed for lifetime cover and after a huge search I only found two companies that don't require that you pay an extra 20% of every claim to their final payout; that's on top of your excess – they charge 20% of the remainder after you've paid your excess. One was called Waggel, the other was Direct Line. Remember also that you won't be covered for preexisting conditions although it is worth asking as a few will add them at an extra charge.
